ALTERNATIVE FUELS AND MATERIAL COMPATIBILITY

As legislation becomes enacted to reduce green house gases, tail pipe emissions, and our reliance on foreign oil the emerging use of alternative fuels and its impact on the storage and distribution infrastructure is becoming more the topic of interest. Certain materials and strategies once implemented to safely store and distribute petroleum hydrocarbons may now find themselves incompatible as biomass fuels like ethanol blends, ethanol fuel, and biodiesel fuels become more the norm. This shift in fuel strategy from petroleum based fuels to biomass fuels can significantly reshape the way we store and distribute fuels in the future.
